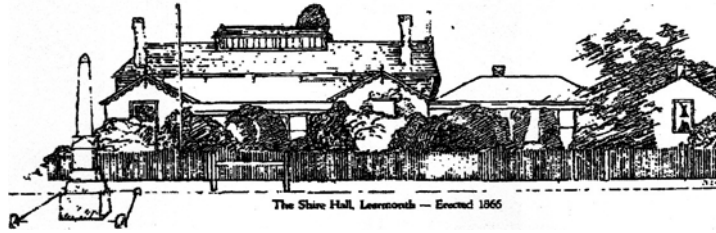

THE ANNUAL DINNER MEETING

As shown above, this year's annual dinner meeting will be held on July 14th at the Learmonth Bowling Club. An invitation is enclosed with this newsletter.

After keeping the meal cost the same for the past 5 years, the Bowling Club has found it necessary to raise the price of the 3 course meal this year. The meal cost, for 3 courses, will now be \$20 per head, remarkable value compared to what you would pay elsewhere.

Membership fees will remain the same, i.e. \$10 per person, \$15 per couple or family, and \$7.50 aged concession. Since the founding of the society, there has been only one increase in fees.

GUEST SPEAKER AT DINNER:

Our guest speaker this year will be Phil Roberts. Phil recently wrote the History of Ballarat College and has now been invited to write the 150 years history of the Ballarat Agricultural and Pastoral Society.

The members of the A. and P. Society were involved in the formation of the Ballarat Roads Board, and a number of them belonged to both organisations. As the offices of the secretaries (sometimes the same person for both) of both these institutions were at Learmonth, and the A. and P. Society also had a Reserve in Learmonth, this area has played an important part in the history of the Society.

Phil Roberts is extremely interested in history and has been in regular contact with our researcher, Claudette Crick, about the forthcoming book.

He is grateful that our society has a good collection of memorabilia about the A. and P. Society.

We are sure you will be most interested to hear Phil speak on the forthcoming book, which will be published later this year. If you have any photos or memorabilia relating to Ballarat Show days, you might like to bring them along to the dinner meeting for members to view.

SPORT IN BYGONE DAYS

At this year's Central Highlands Historical Association History Fair, the theme will be Sports and our society will participating and will have an exhibit in accordance with that theme. Bill Loader is confident we have enough material on Sports to enable us to hold our own Open Day at the Historic Centre on that subject later this year.

INTER TOWN FOOTBALL RIVALRIES BURIED DURING THE WAR

The society recently received a generous donation from Fred and Gwen Wren, in the form of team photographs from Fred's playing days, mostly with Waubra.

Interestingly, there is a photograph of a combined team for Learmonth and Waubra from 1944. Fred recalled that, because of the war, neither club was able to field a team on its own, so they joined forces and entered the team in the Ballarat League. While the team did not win the premiership, it acquitted itself with distinction. In the last game before the finals, Learmonth-Waubra needed to defeat Redan by at least 6 goals to make the finals. While they did win, they did not win by the required margin, so missed out on the September action. It is interesting to note that, this year, both Waubra and Learmonth teams are unbeaten at time of writing. No doubt, some of the names in this photo will bring back memories!
